


WINE RECOMMENDATION



Ganton and Larsen Prospect Winery

2006 Larch Tree Hill Riesling (Okanagan Valley)

With Riesling very much back in fashion, this wine is made and priced to be sold by the glass. It's one of several white wines that the new Prospect Winery is distributing only through restaurants, a strategy to create a consumer buzz for the label in trendy eateries It begins with attractive aromas of peaches and limes; these carry through on the flavours. The wine's 12.5 grams of residual sugar add texture and lift the fruity flavours. There is a balancing acidity (6.9 grams) that keeps the lingering

finish refreshing. The wine is mouthwatering, juicy and appealing. 89 points.

All Prospect Winery labels employ tidbits of Okanagan history. Larch Three Hill was the original name of a mountain at the edge of Osoyoos overlooking some of Mission Hill's top vineyards. The feature is now known as Anarchist Mountain to remember an early settler with politically extreme views.
