

## WINE RECOMMENDATION



La Frenz Winery

2005 Shiraz (Okanagan Valley)

The owners of La Frenz, Jeff and Niva Martin, are Australians, so it is natural that they would call this red Shiraz, not Syrah. As a graduate of Charles Sturt University and a former senior winemaker at McWilliams, Jeff is immersed in the bold

Australian way of styling this variety.

But there's a caveat. This is not a jammy Australian Shiraz but rather one that expresses the cool-climate terroir of the Okanagan's Naramata Bench, where La Frenz grew these grapes. The hallmark of Bench Shiraz is a sensuous elegance. This wine, quite dark in colour, begins with gamy, earthy aromas of plums and cherries, with a hint of pepper. All of this is echoed in flavours of spicy plums and blueberries, supported by subtle French oak notes. The finish is lingering. This is a very appealing wine. 90 points.
